



## **FL-25 Democratic Primary Poll Memo (August 2026)**

*On August 5th, 2026, the Center for Strategic Politics conducted an English-language survey of 403 likely Democratic voters in Florida's 25th Congressional District using SMS to collect web responses. Respondents outside the sampled population were screened by self-identification and voter file match. The sample was weighted to be representative of likely Democratic primary voters by age, race, gender, geography, and education. The margin of error is  $\pm 4.87\%$ . This survey was commissioned by Oliver for Congress.*

**With under two weeks to election day, Oliver Larkin and Jared Moskowitz are in a statistical tie to claim the Democratic nomination in Florida's new 25th Congressional District.** With 20% of voters still undecided, Larkin has a double digit lead among likely voters who haven't yet cast their ballots, and with only a small number of ballots already cast, this race is up for the taking by whoever can best mobilize their supporters and persuade the remaining undecideds. The recent \$650k infusion of pro-Moskowitz outside spending confirms the competitiveness of the race that this newly-released poll from the Center for Strategic Politics finds.

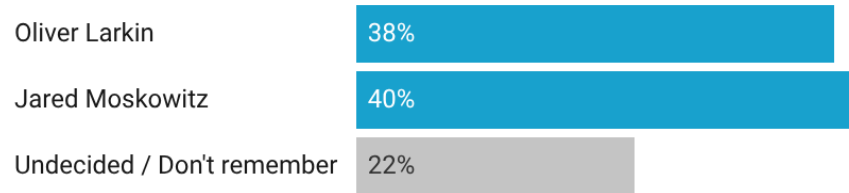

& "If the Democratic primary for Congress were held today, who would you vote for?"

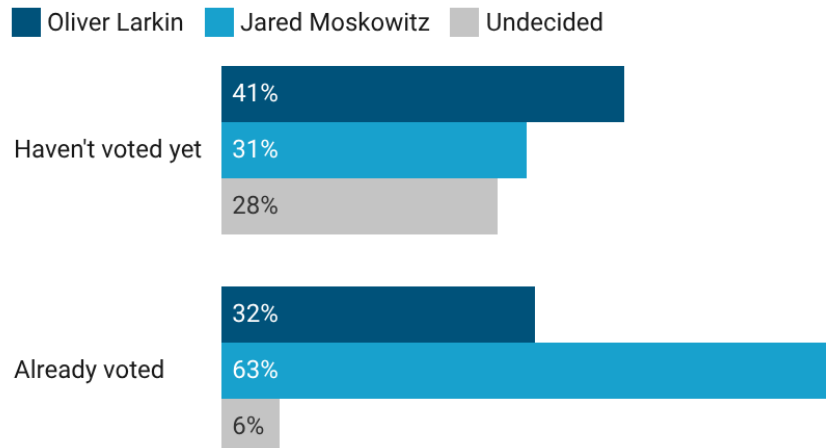


SMS-to-web survey of 403 likely Democratic voters in FL-25 conducted 8/5.

But when separating responses between those two groups, a significant divergence appears.

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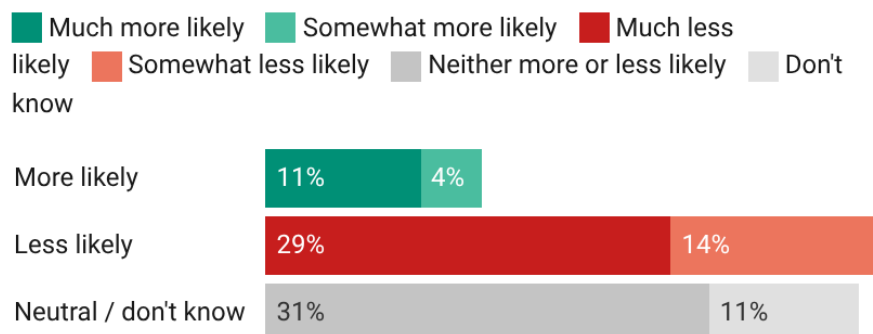
While Larkin enjoys a 10% lead with those who haven't yet voted, Moskowitz has almost two-thirds of the small proportion of people who have already voted early. **Oliver Larkin's path to victory relies on mobilizing his later-voting base to the greatest extent possible.**

## Issues

**AIPAC support has become a deep vulnerability in districts around the country and FL-25 is no different.** 43% of FL-25 Democrats are less likely to support an

AIPAC-backed candidate, only 15% are more likely to, while another 42% either feel neutral or aren't sure how they feel about AIPAC.

## If a candidate is supported by AIPAC or affiliated organizations, does that make you more or less likely to support them?

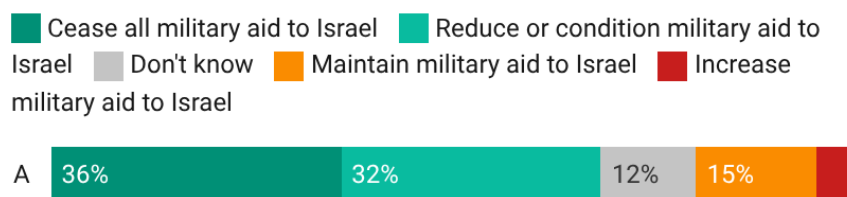


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Support for military aid to Israel is even less popular than AIPAC, with **68% of FL-25 Democrats saying they want to either reduce or cease all military aid to Israel.**

## When it comes to United States military aid to Israel, which of the following comes closest to your view? The U.S. should...

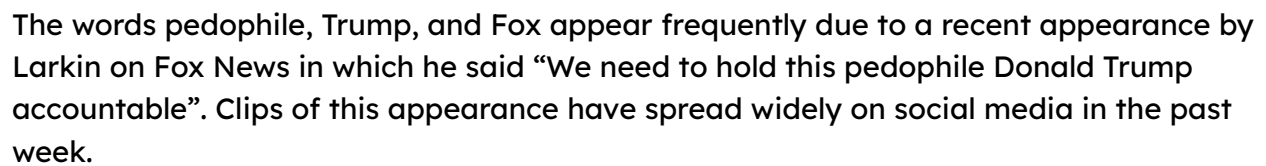
